UNDECIDED VOTERS

Most of consultants did not reflected the percentage of undecided voters, that figure might have been drastically reduced compared to primaries, considering the extreme polarization of the electoral landscape.

POLITICAL KEYS



POLARIZATION OF THE ELECTORAL LANDSCAPE

The general elections take place in a context of extreme polarization between the ruling alliance, *Juntos por el Cambio*, and the opposition coalition, unified in the *Frente de Todos*. This leads to both candidates focusing on capturing the independent non-partisan voter.



FEDERAL STRATEGY

The second instance of the national campaign, aimed at the federalization of the messages of both candidates. In this sense, both Macri with his campaign of #SíSePuede, and Fernández with his actions, deepened their presence in the country specially in the districts that have more relevance in electoral terms.



DEFINITION IN FIRST ROUND

If the figures from the primaries repeat, Sunday's general election would be defined in the first round. This is due not only to the fact that the *Frente de Todos* would exceed the necessary 45%, but also in this new instance blank votes are out the counting base, which leads to an increase in the percentages of each candidate.



UNALIGNED VOTERS

Unaligned voters will be key in the resolution of this election. The last part of the campaign mainly aimed to conquer this segment. However, according to last polls, this group would represent a rather small percentage since the last primaries.

PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS



CITY OF BUENOS AIRES

The primary elections in the City of Buenos Aires left evidenced the preference for the current Mayor, Horacio Rodríguez Larreta, in contrast to the candidate of the "Frente de Todos". Beyond the results obtained, the Executive intends to achieve re-election although fearing of not reaching the 50% necessary to avoid a possible second round against Lammens, which would take place in November.

PROVINCE OF BUENOS AIRES

In the Province of Buenos Aires, the primaries have shown a wide difference between the former Minister of Economy, Axel Kiciloff, over the current Governor, María Eugenia Vidal. In addition, 35 seats for the National House of Representatives will be elected, while 69 province legislators will be chosen. It is important to take into account that this district does count with the possibility of a runoff, setting a complex scenario for the official party.

PROVINCE OF CATAMARCA

At first sight the results of the province primaries have set a scenario hard to reverse, the candidate of the *Frente de Todos*, Raúl Jalil, has obtained a wide difference from Roberto Gómez, the candidate of *Juntos por el Cambio*. Additionally, in this election, the benches of 28 province legislators will be renewed.

PROVINCE OF LA RIOJA

The citizens from the Province of La Rioja, will also vote for governor, national and local representatives, mayors and city councilors. This election will be disputed by three main candidates, Ricardo Quintela and Luis Beder Herrera belonging to the Peronist Party, and Julio Martínez candidate of *Juntos por el Cambio*. It is important to remark that there are no public official or trustworthy polls available.
