

Political Outlook

During his Annual Public Account, Sebastián Piñera apologized for the mistakes made by the Government in controlling the pandemic. He assured that they have always done what they believe "best for Chile" and "sparing no effort" (<u>Source</u>).

The Social Development Commission once again postponed the vote on the project that creates a new Emergency Family Income due to the pandemic. Opposition politicians requested to increase the value and duration of this benefit (<u>Source</u>).

Economic Outlook

- The OECD projects that Chile's Gross Domestic Product will grow 6.7% in 2021. The main reasons for this are the rapid distribution of vaccines and the better world economic prospects (<u>Source</u>).
 - The Chilean economy continues to recover from the serious economic crisis generated by the pandemic and in April it experienced the highest growth in almost 30 years, with an increase of 14.1% (<u>Source</u>).


